## THE TALLIS SCHOLARS



Director: Peter Phillips

The Tallis Scholars specialise in the performance of unaccompanied Renaissance sacred music and have built up a formidable reputation: described in the USA as "a capella superstars" they often perform to standing-room only crowds throughout the world.

Much of their reputation for pioneering work has come from their unique association with Gimell Records: set up in 1981, solely to record them, the catalogue now extends to over thirty prize-winning discs - continuing evidence of their pre-eminent excellence and dedication to one of the great repertoires in Western classical music.

■ The Fairer Sax is far more than a saxophone trio: it is an exciting concept in musical/visual entertainment. With their own brand of humorous interpretation and the unmistakable stamp of glamour and sophistication - this is an outstanding stage show.

■ The Ku-Cheng (Chinese Harp) is a plucked instrument dating from around 200 BC and is the forerunner to the family of Eastern zither.

Zi Lan, who plays both the concert harp and ku-cheng was winning major prizes in China by the age of nine, and at fifteen she won the first prize in the International Liangollen Festival Competition.
